




Working Group 2 Main Outcomes





General information


- Based on results from questionnaire the decision between participants was made to focus on three topics: **shelter capacities, emergency energy supplies** and the issue of **water availability** (drinkable, technical, fire).
- The group agreed to broaden the discussion and take into account the long-term emergencies that are not strictly related to the climate change.
- The above mentioned are beyond the boundaries of the Civil Protection.





SHELTER CAPACITY

- The need of the more in-depth analysis of different type of accommodation.
- Current crisis showed that the tents/containers etc. are not preferable solution for long-term emergency.
- Participants agreed on more detailed analysis across MS which would be focused on sheltering capacities including mapping current capacities in MS.





EMERGENCY ENERGY SUPPLY (EES)


- EES is now creating under the rescEU. Nevertheless due to the UA crisis this issue wasn't discussed on the expert level.
- It is challenge for future steps in UCPM in broader consequences including using of alternative source of energy.
- EES (generators) alone are not enough – there is a need for experts and staff.





WATER SUPPLY


- Following the discussion between participants was agreed using only two definitions – drinkable water and water resources for fire extinguishing.
- The need for more in-depth discussion about the availability of different types of water related to expected climate change in EU (drought and lack of natural sources of water).
- Questions regarding water purification are covered by national resources and UCPM.






OTHER ISSUES
